July 1972 is eligible for the Vietnam Service Medal . . . I have verified our eligibility. There are some mildly confusing words in SecNavInst 1650.1E (Navy Awards Manual) regarding noneligibility if on training duty but when I pressed (OpNav) for an interpretation, I was assured those words were for TAD and Reserve personnel. So, the bottom line is all Midshipmen who were aboard VANCOUVER are eligible to wear the Medal and a single 3/16" bronze star." NOTE: Before all you Class of 75 "War Heroes" demand your medals, I recommend that you individually verify your eligibility. Anyone wishing to confirm this can check with the Navy by calling (202) 695-4123. Mark also ran into Rick Schwarthing in Charleston. Rick is an EDO with a specialty in diving and salvage.
