#2 I attempted to send a recipe earlier but I'm not sure you got it. Here it is one more time. "DEER" VINNIE'S VENISON JERKY—1 1/4 C soy sauce, 1/4 C brown sugar, 1/8 C liquid smoke, 2 Tsp Tabasco, 1 Tsp lemon juice

Prior to putting the meat into the marinade, cut it into 1/8th inch thick strips. If the meat is still slightly frozen it really helps in the slicing process. Coat top of meat after marinated with garlic and crushed red pepper (if you like it hot) prior to drying. I use a dehydrator but several of my friends use the oven and leave it cracked to let the moisture escape. Of course you will have to adjust the quantity of mix according to the amount of meat
