place the largest pigskin mesh they had. The liver had many cysts that had to be taken out in order to get the liver in the abdominal cavity. He has an anchor appearing scar on his abdomen (3 incisions). This is quite fitting for a Navy guy. He spent the first post op 24 hours in intensive care. He reports very little sleep.

He has had some rough days, has not enjoyed coughing or moving. Since in the hospital he has gained 14 lbs. and this is not due to good food. The kidney has not been working as well, he's very anemic and he has received a lot of fluid. Today however, is a better day, kidney function is improving and getting up is easier. He still dreads the cough, but feels a little better. We do not know when we will be home, soon I hope. For now we are staying on a special floor that has a great view, great room, excellent service, a sitting area and bed for Tina. It is always good for the caregiver to get some rest, she is less cranky.

My apologies for a weak effort this month. I'll do better, I promise!
