

Last year for something very different, Alan went to the Dominican Republic as a wheelchair mechanic with Wheels for the World.

In early February '14, he went to Honduras with Living Water to drill a well to provide clean water for an entire village that had electricity and dirty water, but no clean water. He really wanted to go, but the second trip was not in the budget. He prayed, submitted a deposit and then posted a plea for help on Facebook. His prayer was answered by Jack Fernandez. Alan wanted to thank Jack once again for helping out a classmate. By the way, both those projects were successful. They completed the well, so the village has clean water and the other town now has a great medical clinic with plenty of room for visiting medical teams.
