It's been a long time since **Andy Mohler** (18th) checked in. But he did in early May. He's been very involved in the Navy League since retiring in 2004. He served as Central Florida Council President for 3 years. It's a very active council supporting 13 NJROTCs, two Sea Cadet units, active duty Coast Guard and Navy units, and work with many different veterans' organizations (www.cfnavyleague.org). One of the big projects they took on was to design, fund, construct, and donate a Lone Sailor Navy Memorial on the site of the former Recruit Training Center (RTC Orlando) and Nuclear Power School. The base was closed in a BRAC, demolished in '99, and redeveloped into a very nice Park - Bluejacket Park to be exact. This was the site of the famous (to locals and RTC grads at least) wooden destroyer training ship called USS Bluejacket. Aside from a small plaque there was no acknowledgement of the long Navy history in Orlando. After seven years of fundraising for more than \$450K, design, running a construction competition, negotiating with the City of Orlando and finally construction, they just dedicated phase one. This made their site the 14th Lone Sailor Memorial in the United States. Their Memorial contains some unique design elements apart from the bronze statue, such as a sea services compass rose, a wood grained pier structure, a paver walkway (300+ sold and yes you can still buy one!). They are going to finish the memorial wall by the Navy Birthday. This will be a storyboard telling the history of what went on at the site for more than 30 years. They also plan to design a female bronze Sailor, using the local Orlando arts community, to complement our Lone Sailor. This is in acknowledgement of the fact that Orlando RTC was the first coed boot camp. Here are some pics during design, and the final product. Andy also had the

pleasure of reconnecting with **Dave Buss** (34th) at the NAWCTSD Change of Command in April. Dave and Andy were in Airwing Seven many years back. They have hardly seen each other since then. They t was great fun catching up. They were laughing at the recent Russian flyby, thinking back to how much better (and lower!)
