■ It's Christmas Eve, and I'm writing to you about Ensign Joshua Watson, killed at NAS Pensacola during a terrorist attack. His actions speak highly of himself and the institution from which he graduated and represented so valiantly. Two of our classmates, Ken Shearer (34th Co.) and Mike McCarthy (19th Co.), had the opportunity to meet Josh at a recent GLE. I wanted to share their thoughts with the Class. Please remember Ensign Watson's family during this holiday season.

As written by Ken:



Our Class first met Joshua Kaleb Watson at the Gettysburg Leadership Experience in June 2018, before he was posthumously introduced to the world this past December. Participating in the GLE program '77 sponsors, Mike McCarthy and I had the honor and privilege to meet and engage with Josh over the course of the two-day event. All of the participants embodied the values of fidelity, honor and discipline instilled in us at the Naval Academy. Mike and I were proud to observe and get to meet the future leaders of our Navy and Marine Corp, including Josh, who captained the Navy rifle team. Little did we realize he would be put to the ultimate test a short 18 months later at the Pensacola Naval Air Station.

As many of you now know, Josh was killed in the line of duty on December 6th. What's striking is, while all of us were exposed to the concepts of leadership by example, self-sacrifice and courage under fire, most of us never faced the crucible of combat, and thus have wondered since how we would react. There was no question on that day for Josh. He immediately sprang into action, first attempting to disarm the gunman; then, despite having been shot 5 times, still managed to exit the building and provide authorities with details crucial to limiting the loss of life and bringing the incident to a quick conclusion. Many more members of our Military would have been injured or killed without his rapid response.

The Class of 1977 would like to recognize his heroism, sacrifice and commitment to duty by sharing this posting with the entire Naval Academy family and all the men and women of America's Armed Forces.
